## DUAL ENROLLMENT OPTIONS

Crown offers Dual Enrollment to qualified students who are non-Minnesota residents. This program permits students to earn college credit, which may be applied to a degree program at Crown or transferred to another institution. Students can take classes online with other high school students. The courses are taught by Crown's credentialed faculty members. The courses have a low student to instructor ratio and are offered in a 15 week semester format. All students are supported by a dedicated academic advisor.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are available to students who attended Crown as dual-enrolled students and then enroll as full-time first-year students the following academic year. The maximum amount of this renewable scholarship is \$2,000 per year if attending on campus. Students must demonstrate financial need as determined by the FAFSA. Students enrolling in the School of Online Studies are eligible for a 25% off tuition scholarship.

## APPLICATION INFO

Students must have a minimum **3.0** high school **GPA**.

*No standardized tests are required for admission.*

Application Deadlines:  
August 1 (Fall) or December 1 (Spring)

To register, students must complete the following:

- An online application to Crown
- An official high school transcript
- An Advising form

Tuition is \$85/credit; No additional fees
