## MAIN TAB SPEAKERS DR. RON & ANITA MORRISON

**Dr. Ron and Mrs. Anita Morrison** are our opening speakers in the Main Tabernacle services. In 1995, the Morrisons planted Hope Alliance Bible Church in Maple Heights, Ohio, where they continue to serve today.

Before planting Hope Alliance Bible Church, Pastor Ron served in the U.S. Army and worked for the Lincoln Electric Company in Cleveland for 21 years. In addition to being the Senior Pastor at Hope Alliance Bible Church, Pastor Ron founded the Alliance for Family Hope in 2008. He also served on the Board of Directors of the C&MA for sixteen years. Ron is the Urban Ministries Coach for the Central District of the C&MA, serves on the LO&CC, and is the President of the African American Association of Pastors of the C&MA. He also assists urban pastors, churches, and schools in raising up African American leaders for Kingdom Advancement.

Anita Morrison has been a member of Hope Alliance Bible Church for over 28 years and holds both a bachelor's degree in social work from Cleveland State University and a Master of Education from John Carroll University. Anita worked for 12 years with families struggling with chemical addiction. Since then, she has enjoyed teaching in many capacities and currently works with the tutoring program at the Alliance for Family Hope. Anita leads worship, teaches an adult women's bible study, has been in a women's accountability group for 35 years, and has taught the Word of God at women's retreats. She also has the occasional privilege of team teaching with her husband.

# TOTAL MINISTRY HEALTH FOR LEADERS

Ministry leaders, are you coming to Mahaffey Camp worn out, discouraged, or even thinking about stepping out of ministry all together? If so, or if you simply want to talk, take time to set up an appointment with Scott Ream. Scott, one of our own district workers, has experienced these same feelings. He is the founder and director of Total Ministry Health, Inc. (TMH). Total Ministry Health is a non-profit organization which provides ministry health/burnout assessments, coaching and mentoring services for healing, restoration, and greater effectiveness. #### FIRST AID STATION (located at the Welcome Center)

First Aid Station volunteers are available during the following hours: 9-11:30am, 1:30-3:30pm, 6:30-8pm. This is on a limited basis when personnel are available. Nearby Urgent Care centers as well as Emergency Room services are located both in Punxsutawney and DuBois.

In case of an emergency during nonscheduled hours, contact security or call the after-hours emergency number for first aid on call at 814-592-6814. Please only use this number in an emergency after hours.

**Dumpsters** are located throughout the campground for your household refuse disposal. Please do not put cardboard, wood, building supplies, furniture, branches, etc. in the dumpster. During Family Camp there is no curbside pickup for leaves, branches or garbage. Leaves and branches may be placed at the mulch pile. Please do not dump items up at the soccer field hill including mattresses or furniture.

Please help us keep the camp a beautiful and welcoming place. Parents, grandparents, and sponsors of youth here on the grounds, you will be held responsible for any damage or defacement of camp property caused by your teen or child. This includes graffiti in the rest rooms, dorms, tabernacles, etc. Your assistance in discussing this with those in your care will be greatly appreciated. Please explain the consequences of their unsolicited artwork and the extra expense it causes the camp to cover it up.
